



# Guide to Family Conversations about Technology and Screen Use

Technology is a good gift of human creativity—but like all gifts, it must be used under God's wisdom. The goal of these conversations is formation, not fear: shaping hearts, habits, and loves so that technology serves God's purposes rather than replacing them.

*"All things are lawful for me," but not all things are helpful. (1 Corinthians 6:12)*

## 1. Begin With Grace, Curiosity, and Prayer

Create a safe space where honesty is welcomed.

### Questions to ask:

- What do you enjoy about technology?
- Where do you feel tempted or distracted?
- When does technology help you love God and others—and when does it get in the way?

## 2. Teach a Biblical View of Technology

Core truths – Language, “Technology is a tool, not a treasure.”

- Technology reflects God-given creativity (Genesis 1:27).
- Technology is not neutral—it shapes our hearts and habits.
- Technology can serve love of God and neighbor—or compete for our worship.

## 3. Talk About the Heart, Not Just the Screen

Scripture focuses on formation of desire, not mere behavior management.

### Discuss:

- What captures your attention the most?
- What do you turn to for comfort, escape, or validation?
- How does technology shape your thoughts, moods, or identity?

*"Above all else, guard your heart, for everything you do flows from it." (Proverbs 4:23)*

## 4. Speak Honestly About Sin, Temptation, and Grace

### Address openly:

- Pornography and sexual temptation
- Comparison, envy, and pride
- Anger, cruelty, and anonymity online
- Escapism and avoidance of real responsibilities

### Promise:

*"No matter what you encounter online, you will receive help—not shame—when you come to us."*

## 5. Set Boundaries as Discipleship, Not Punishment

Rules exist to protect what God calls good. Limits help us love God fully and grow freedom alongside responsibility.

## 7. Return to the Conversation Often

Commit to ongoing conversations, regular reviews, and prayerful discernment.

### Closing Question:

*"How can we use technology in ways that help us love God, love others, and live faithfully?"*
